#### A Brief History of the College

Jaleswar is situated in reverine area of the mighty Bharamaputara in Goalpara District. The people in this area are backward socially, economically as well as educationally. There was no any institution of Higher Education in Jaleswar. At that time Hon'ble Afzalur Rahman was an MLA of Jaleswar Constituency who keenly observed all the scenario of his constituency and tried heart and soul to fulfill the entire aspects. In order to educate the poor and downtrodden people of the constituency, Afzalur Rahman decided to establish such kind of institution which is the part and parcel to develop the society. His high and philosophical thinking and love for the people encourage him to face any challenge to establish a college in such remote area. The needs of the people came to his soft heart spontaneously and take a bold step to establish a college.

In the year 1981 his only dream came to true. He constituted a committee of the college and named the college as 'Jaleswar College, Tapoban'. A committee was constituted with required members. Afzalur Rahman was the President of the committee and the secretary was Atowar Rahman. The founder Principal of the college was Abdullah Saleh Uddin and the others were come voluntarily to serve the college. He had purchased 24 Bhigas of land at his own expense. He had constructed temporary shed on the said land and started H.S and B.A 1st year classes. This shed was damaged by cyclone twice but reconstructed with full shape and the class was running smoothly. The college was started with eleven departments i.e English, MIL. Assamese, Hindi, History, Economics, Political Science, Arabic, Education, Mathematics, Linguistics and Philosophy. The classes started from 14th August 1981. There are only few students who admitted in the HS 1st year class. Only few students were admitted in the BA 1st year. The college has been running smoothly.

To run the college he constituted H.R. Trust in the name of his father Habibar Rahman. He collected the money and deposited in the Trust from his salary, T.A etc and business. The patron bears all the affairs to maintain the college with his strong personality. He bought total 45 Bhigas of land for the college. The present building was constructed in 1992 while he was the Panchyat and Rural Development Minister of Assam. He conducted all and every aspect of the college with the help of 'Habibar Rahman Trust'. But the most interesting thing is that he would not take any contribution from others. His sacrifice for the college is admirable. He is dedicating his valuable time to the family of the college. He also preferred to reside the lecture in the additional parts of the college building. He has no daughter so he always said, "Jaleswar College is my daughter". His thinking caters the need of the future generation. It is an immortal sign of the patron.

But in 1991 the present Principal Dr. Abdul Mannan, was appointed. After that the rest of the professors were appointed. As per Govt. rule Higher Secondary section was separated from the college in 1996. The college affiliated to the Gauhati University in 1996. The University offered the centre of the examination in 1994. The college was provincialised on 01-01 2013.

#### ABOUT FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP):

The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) under Gauhati University based on the NEP (National Education Policy-2020). Though, the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called Honours and Pass courses existing under CBCS.

#### **Duration:**

While under CBCS, Degree course has a 3-year degree programme but in the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

#### **Exits & Entries:**

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There was no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice. A student has a (Academic Bank of Credit) ABC where his/ her marks will be stored and he can exit and re enter in this programme then his/her marks will continue from his ABC. One has to exit from the programme after one year, after two years and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree and finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree with Honours.

**IMPORTANT:** If one exit in the middle, the doors are still open for him/her to enter into the programme again and he/she can start the journey from where he/she left.

#### Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP):

#### **ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)**

The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC a notified by the regulatory agencies.

#### **Progression and exits**

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

#### (a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirement is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational/Skill course).

#### (b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirement is 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational/Skill course).

#### (c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, s/he can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirement is 120.

#### (d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirement is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate/diploma/degree is awarded only if the student clears (ie, passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

#### **Credit Framework:**

Each semester of a 4-Year Bachelor Degree (FYUGP) course will have a maximum of 22 credits with a total of 132 credits for 3-Year Degree Course and 176 credits for a 4-Year Degree Course. Apparently, the Masters Course will have 44 credits in a year with a total of 88 credits in two years. The baseline for total credits is 120 for a 3-Year course and 160 for a 4-Year course. So, a student can choose to have a total credit between 120 and 132 by the end of a 3-Year.

#### **Bachelor Degree course**

The basic division of credits for a 3-Year Bachelor Degree course is shown in figure alongside. The basic division for a 4-Year course is shown in Fig.fig: Division-of-credits-1 and fig: Division-of-credits-1-1. In the 4th year, there are however two options - (a) Degree with Honours and (b) Degree with Honours and Research. Overall, a 3-Year Degree course consists of two sections-a Core Section and a Common Section. While the Core Section consists of Major and Minor papers, the Common Section is divided into 5 sub-groups.

#### **Internship:**

All students is to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. Degree with Major / Minor 120 Credits

#### **Requirements for admission:**

- i. Students who seek admission to college shall have to apply in prescribe form available with the prospectus.
- ii. Major and Minor will be offered at the time of admission.

#### iii. Students need to submit the following photo copies of documents: -

- a) Marks sheet and pass certificate of the last examination (2 copies)
- b) HSLC Certificate, Marks sheet, Admit card (for age verification), each (2 copies).
- c) Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- d) Caste Certificate/Gap period certificate/ Migration certificate/ Disability Certificate if required.
- e) Registration Certificate of AHSEC/GU (2 Copies)
- f) It is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC ID as notified by the regulatory agencies at the time of GU registration.
- g) In respect of reservation under games and sports quota and extracurricular activities, only state and national certificates from competent authority will be considering.
- h) Two copies of latest passport size colour photos with white background.
- i) Photo copy of tree plantation (for fee waiver candidate)
- j) Bank passbook Xerox copy.
- k) Aadhar and PAN card Xerox copies.

iv. Original copies of certificates and marks sheet will be produced at the time of submission of online receipt.

#### **College Examination:**

- a) In the present semester system (FYUGP) 40% of total marks come from Internal Examination and rest 60% from end semester evaluation.
- b) The Students must appear the sessional examination conducted by the college. No application seeking exemption from appearing the sessional examination will be entertained. However, if any student fails to appear in the sessional examination, due to some genuine, he/she will duly apply to the head of the dept. concerned and must appear in the sessional exam within 10 days from the completion of scheduled dates of each sessional exam.
- c) Without appearing the sessional examination conducted by the college, the students are not allowed to appear in the final examination.

Application form for admission must be submitted to the office. The submitted form must be completed in all respects. Incomplete forms are liable to be rejected.

- (vi) Photo Copy of tree plantation (for fee waiver candidate)
- (vii) ABC ID and Bank Passbook Xerox Copy.
- (viii) Students must submit his/her photo, Aadhaar Card and Income Certificate (only for Fee waiver category Students) and income certificate issued by Circle Officer only will be acceptable.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:**

(i) Right of admission is reserved by the college authority.

- (ii) Students are admitted strictly on merit basis.
- (iii) Reservation of seats for SC/ST/MOBC/EWS will be in accordance with the rules existing at the time of admission.
- (iv) Preference will be given to the students having high standard qualities of extra curricular activities and outstanding sportsmanship. The quota is limited.
- (v) Seats remained vacant after fulfilling rules (ii), (iii) and (iv) above will be filled by general category candidates.

#### **MANAGEMENT:**

The college is managed by the Governing Body constituted by the Govt. of Assam.

#### **FEES STRUCTURE:**

Admission and other fees structure will be as per prescribed by Govt. of Assam. It will be intimated in College website and College notice board before the commencement of admission process.

#### ATTENDANCE:

As per University rules 75% attendance in the classes is compulsory.

#### **OTHER AMENITIES:**

#### I) IDENTITY CARD:

Every student on admission will be issued with an Identity Card which is to be kept with him/her during the college hours. At the end of each academic session, the old Identity Card is to be surrendered for renewal.

#### II) LIBRARY CARD:

A student is provided with a Library Card with the facility to borrow two books at a time. A Major student can borrow 4 (four) books at a time which are to be returned within a maximum of 15 days. In addition there is a reading room to go through news papers and periodicals. A student must return the Library Card at the end of each session.

#### III) TUTORIAL CLASSES:

In addition to the regular routine classes, the authority arranges for tutorial classes in certain subjects. It is compulsory for the students to attend the same.

#### IV) STUDENTS UNION:

Jaleswar College, Tapoban Students Union (JCTSU) is the general body of students of the College and all the students are members of the Union. The students seeking to contest the Union Election must attend minimum of 75% classes held till the date of notification of the Election.

#### V) POOR FUND:

The Jaleswar College, Tapoban Students Union has Poor Fund facility. Generally, the financially weak students are provided with some financial assistance from this Fund at the time of form-fill-up for University Examinations.

#### VI) COLLEGE MAGAZINE & WALL MAGAZINE:

Jaleswar College Students' Union publishes a yearly magazine which provides the students and also the staff of the college an opportunity to display their creative talents. In addition to this, there is a general Wall Magazine and Departmental Wall Magazines which also serve the same purpose.

#### VII) SCHOLARSHIPS:

- 1. Meritorious Students belonging to religious minority category who attains at least 50% marks in the last final examination will be awarded Post Matric Scholarship as prescribed by the Govt. of Assam.
- 2. Post-Matric Scholarship for ST/SC/OBC/MOBC and Minority Girls' students will be awarded as prescribed by the Govt. of Assam.

#### VIII) College Library

A well stocked library exists in the college premises. The library comprises of various Journals, Magazines and text books. Students can enjoy the benefits of the library services from the college library as per rules. Assamese and English daily newspapers are regularly subscribed which are of immense utility to the student community.

#### VII) SUPPORT SERVICES IN THE COLLEGE:

For a better teaching-learning experience in the college the following support service are offered as -

- 1. The students securing highest marks in Council and University ex-aminations are rewarded.
- 2. The most regular and punctual students are rewarded.
- 3. The teachers of the departments who show good results are encouraged by offering certificates of proficiency.
- 4. Departmental seminars, workshops are organized for the benefit of the students.
- 5. Quiz competition, debate, extempore speech etc. are held at regular intervals for updating the knowledge of the students.

#### IX) College Canteen:

Jaleswar College, Tapoban has a canteen which serves nutritious and hygienic food to the students and staffs.

#### **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

- 1. Students must abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
- 2. A student shall be subjected to disciplinary action if he/she is found to be disobedient or indecent in his/her behaviour with the teachers, other employees, and students and with the college authority.
- 3. A student who is found to have violated the rules and regulations of the college shall be liable to expulsion.
- 4. A student must have the college identity card.
- 5. Wearing of college uniform is compulsory during the college hours.
- 6. Ragging, smoking or taking drugs are strictly prohibited in the college premises. Anyone found indulging in ragging and taking drug in any form on the college campus will be expelled from the college instantly.

#### **COLLEGE UNIFORM:**

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
